Our School procedures for the bushfire season

Fire danger ratings and warnings are used in Victoria to provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life.

Schools and children's services listed on the DET Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) will be closed on days declared by Fire Authorities as a Code Red fire danger day.

Our school has been identified as being one of those at high bushfire risk and is listed on the BARR.

Where possible, we will provide parents with up to three days notice of a planned closure. We will contact you directly by letter with advice on planned closures and will confirm the decision to close by 12 noon the day before the planned closure. The communication process at our school will be:

A notice will be sent to all families as soon as we have notification of a Code Red Day. This may be up to 3 days in advance.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that:

- ◆ No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Code Red day.
- ◆ Out-of-school-hours care will also be cancelled on these days
- ◆ School camps will be cancelled if a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined for the Bureau of Meteorology

district in which the camp is located.

On these Code Red days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – on such days children should never be left at home or in the care of older children.

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that when Code Red days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Code Red day.

What can parents do?

- ♦ Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is closed.
- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers. Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters and by talking to your child's teacher or any other member of the teaching staff about our emergency management plan.

If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.

Chaplin's Corner

The Spirit of the Word

Compassion Empathy Respect Love

These are words we don't hear very often in today's world. I think this is unfortunate. They are words that carry much meaning. They are words heavy with purpose, action and sentiment, and yet they are not sentimental words. To put these words into action takes much effort in the form of thought, understanding, intention and humanity.

These words aren't easy to put into action. We can't tick a box. We can't come up with a formula, or a set of criteria. This is why these words are so complex in our increasingly simple thinking society and therefore a decrease in their use.

Can compassion, empathy, respect and love be taught? This is partly the purpose of our Social and Emotional Learning Curriculum, what you might hear your student referring to as 'learning circle' or 'circle time'. We are teaching students to keep an eye and ear out for the pain in the other. This is what compassion is, sharing in the pain of the other and suffering together.

Empathy is to not only feel and share the pain but to step into the shoes of the other person, and see and try to and imagine the situation from the other person's perspective.

To have compassion, empathy and respect comes secondary to the primary virtue of love. Not romantic love or sexual but the love for our fellow human beings. Not only the love of friends and family but for the stranger. This is a much harder sort of love. It is the foundation for a humane and descent society. Without this kind of love there would be no compassion, no empathy and no respect. This is not simplistic. This is complex and its difficult, and this is why Social and Emotional Learning is such a large part of our school curriculum and part of the reason why chaplains are employed in schools.

Love is the foundation of everything.
