To ensure greater consistency of teacher practice we have identified the need for an Instructional [pedagogical] Model will provide a framework for teachers to have a shared understanding of how curriculum is delivered [in all curriculum areas] at Hastings PS.  Hastings PS has identified a need to develop greater collaborative approaches that will ensure that current practice is evaluated against researched best practice and that student data is monitored to ensure all students outcomes improve. Evidence based research demonstrates that when whole staff utilise the PLC approach, teachers capacity to diagnose student learning needs will improve.  For the purpose of monitoring/reporting to our KIS, and recognising the similarity to our Numeracy KIS we have decided to combine our actions for Numeracy into our SSP Literacy Goal.
