Gradual Transition to School

We are all extremely excited that our school will once again have the sounds and smiling faces of our students. We are however, also aware that the virus still exists in our society and that we need to be slow and cautious in our approach and have safety measures in place to protect the students and staff at our school.

Return to School Dates

Please remember that returning to school will be completed in 2 stages.

Stage 1: Foundation, Year 1 and Year 2 students to end remote learning this Friday and return to school on Tuesday 26th May.

Stage 2: Students in Year 3-6 will continue online learning until their return to school on Tuesday 9th June.

Online Learning

All students are expected to continue with online learning until they are required to be back onsite.

This means that Foundation, Year 1 and Year 2 students will continue their virtual check in and classes with their teachers until this Friday.

Year 3-6 students will continue to get online support from their teachers until their return date. They are expected to continue virtual check ins and classes until Friday 5th June. Please note Monday 8th is Queen's Birthday Holiday.

During these two weeks, the existing model of onsite support for students who cannot be supervised at home will stay in place.

School Operations

As outlined previously the Victorian Chief Health Officer has advised that students will <u>not</u> be required to maintain social distancing whilst at school. However, there will be a number of

important changes to our school operations, School Drop off/ Pick Up which will apply until further notice. We know that some of these may be an inconvenience but We ask parents/carers to observe physical ask that you do the right thing by supporting us distancing measures during drop off and pick up to protect the health and safety of our community. Please take note of the following:

- To support all school staff to prepare for this transition, Monday 25th May will be a 🖕 pupil-free day (no students in attendance).
- Students in Foundation, One and Two will start at 9am (doors opening at 8.50am) and \bullet be dismissed at 3.15pm
- Staff will be stationed at the Victoria Street & Hodgins Rd gates from 8.40 am − 9.10 am . and we ask that all students remain inside cars or parents/carers time their arrival for this time.

As per Department guidelines there will be further changes to support this transition and protect the health and safety of students at . school. Please take note of the following main points:

- Visitors to school grounds will be limited to those delivering or supporting essential school services and operations. During this period and until further notice, parents will be required to drop off and pick up outside of the school boundary.
- Activities dependent on and involving parents, such as parent helpers in the classroom are cancelled until further notice.
- Parents accessing the office must only use the Victoria St ext. gate and are not permitted to walk through the school.
- We ask that any parents/carers wishing to ٠ discuss any matters with their child's teacher or another staff member do so via email.
- Parents are encouraged to contact the office via phone or email if they have
- inquiries. They must only enter the office if absolutely essential or invited to do so.

times. To minimise interaction of students and adults within the school and at entry points during pick up and drop off times we:

- Will have staff members will be present at the Victoria St & Hodgins Rd gates from 8.40 am- 9:10am.
- Will have staff members will be present at the Victoria St & Hodgins Rd gates from 3:10 pm—3:30pm.
- Encourage parents at the front gate to social distance as per the signs attached to the front fence.
- Encourage parents who park in the angle parking on Victoria St ext. to remain in their cars and ask their children to be watching carefully for their arrival.
- Ask that parents/carers do not linger while picking up or dropping off students.

Foundation Drop Off Point

- Foundation students [Mr. Minehan and Ms. Thorne] will be required to enter school via the Victoria St ext. gate between 8.40 am -8.50 am.
- P1M and PT Teachers and ES will be waiting in the main courtyard.
- Students will line up with their teacher and then be taken to class

Foundation Pick up Point

- Teachers and ES staff will bring all Foundation students out into the main courtyard for a 3:15pm dismissal.
- Foundation Students will be collected from the Victoria St ext. gate between 3:15 pm-3:30pm.

Year 1 & Year 2 Drop Off Point

- Year 1 and Year 2 students [Mrs. Barrie, Mrs. Doherty and Mrs. Reid] will be required to enter school via the Hodgins Rd gate between 8.40 am - 8.50 am.
- 12B and 12D Teachers and ES will be waiting on the Basketball courts.
- Students will line up with their teacher and School then be taken to class.

Year 1 & Year 2 Pick up Point

- Teachers and ES staff will bring Yr 1 and Yr 2 students out to the basketball courts for dismissal at 3:15pm.
- Yr 1 & Yr 2 students will be collected from the Hodgins Road ext. gate between 3:15pm - 3:30pm.

Student Early Departure

We understand that there will be circumstances Flow Chart over the page. where your child/ren will need to be collected from school earlier than the allocated pick up times and locations.

Parents that need to pick students up early should contact the office via phone once parked outside the school. Students will be called down to the office ready to go to a parent's car on arrival.

We appreciate that some of these requirements outlined in this newsletter will be an

inconvenience but hope you will understand that by following these we will help to stop the spread of the virus and protect all members of our school community. By following these measures we will hopefully be back to a normal school day sooner rather than later.

Hygiene & Health at Hastings Primary

Hastings Primary School will continue to enhance cleaning routines and will encourage frequent hand washing.

We have had 25 hand sanitizer dispensers installed in classrooms and around the school this week.

We do ask that if your child is ill or is feeling unwell, they must not attend school. They must remain home and seek medical advice.



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

The app celebrates creativity with videos recorded in 15 seconds or less and shared across the Tik Tok community.

You have the ability to make cool, short videos-songs or short dialogues - that you can share with the world, and people can see them. Think MTV meets SNL meets karaoke meets Dubsmash meets American Idol meets Instagram.

Challenges

- 12+ content in the songs lyrics. Swearing and adult concepts in the provided music. 0
- Pornography, graphic content, suicide notes.
- 0 Tik Tok users can search for other users to view or follow near their own location/city.
- User generated videos can be viewed and shared onto other social media and messaging apps increasing exposure.
- Bullying in comments. 0
- Users can publicise their messenger usernames or social media profiles on their Tik Tok profile.
- Many underage accounts with large amounts of followers.
- Easy for users to create multiple accounts and hide them from their parents.
- Fake Tik Tok apps on the app store that 0 charge for download or offer followers.

NOTE: TikTok offers a live feature for users with 1000+ followers on their profile. This service is intended for ages 16+

How Do I Delete My Tik Tok Account?

- Open the Tik Tok app and login. 0
- Tap on the person icon at the lower right 0 of your screen to open your profile.
- Click on the three dots located in the o upper right corner.
- Click on 'Privacy and Settings'. 0
- Click on 'Manage my Account'. 0
- Add a phone number if you haven't 0 already.

- A verified phone number is a requirement for removing your Tik Tok account.
- O Scroll to the bottom of the page where it says 'Thinking about removing your account?' Tap it.
- O Tap 'Send Code'
- Wait for the code to be sent.
 Enter the 4-digit code within 60 seconds
- of it being sent to you. Then hit continue. O Read over the implications of removing your account. Hit continue if you agree
- with the terms. 0
- Hit 'Delete Account'. You'll be logged out and your account will be deleted.



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

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
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
