Message from the Principal



Foundation—Yr2 students back onsite for the past week. I have enjoyed greeting students and families during the drop off and pick up times.

It was lovely to see so many smiling faces outside the school gates too, as parents and carers farewelled students.

We are excited to have the remainder of our students returning next week following the Queens Birthday long weekend.

Students in Year 3-6 will finish remote online learning this Friday and return to school on Tuesday 9th June.



Thank you to the families who read last week's newsletter outlining all the operations we have in place for this week. I have asked staff to remain flexible and we will alter or enhance any aspects of the plan as needed.

As parents, you are an important piece of our puzzle. We need you to be hyper vigilant about the health of your children and if they are showing any signs or symptoms of illness, please DO NOT send them to school.

Staff will also be monitoring closely and we will call you to collect your child if we deem necessary.

As we have all students returning to onsite

learning next week we ask parents/carers to continue to observe physical distancing measures during drop off and pick up times.

The school will continue to implement the following;

- All students will start at 9am (doors opening at 8.50am) and be dismissed at 3.15pm.
- ♦ Staff will continue to be stationed at the Victoria Street & Hodgins Rd gates from 8.40 am - 9.10 am and 3:10—3:30pm to assist with drop off and pick up of students.
- Visitors to school grounds will continue to be <u>limited</u> to those delivering or supporting essential school services and operations. During this period and until further notice, parents will be required to drop off and pick up outside of the school boundary.
- We ask that any parents/carers wishing to discuss any matters with their child's teacher or another staff member do so via email.
- Parents are encouraged to contact the office via phone or email if they have inquiries. They must only enter the office if absolutely essential or invited to do so.
- Parents who have arranged a time to attend school must only use the Victoria St ext. gate and are not permitted to walk through the school. A bell is located outside to school office to notify the staff of your arrival and we will come out and meet you.

Pick up & Drop Off Points

Foundation Students

 Foundation students will continue to be dropped at the Victoria Street gate between 8.40 am − 8.50 am.

- Students will meet their teachers in the courtyard and be taken to class.
- Teachers and ES staff will bring all Foundation students out into the main courtyard for a 3:15pm dismissal.
- the Victoria St ext. gate between 3:15 pm-3:30pm.

Year 1 & Year 2

- Year 1 and Year 2 students will continue to be dropped off via the Hodgins Rd gate between 8.40 am - 8.50 am.
- All students will meet on the basketball extension. courts and taken to class by their teachers.
- students out to the basketball courts for dismissal at 3:15pm.
- the Hodgins Road ext. gate between 3:15pm centre line. -3:30pm.

3K & 34H Students

- to the senior playground between 8:40am -8:50am.
- All students will wait at the undercover area and will be taken to class by their teacher.
- same area and dismissed from these gates at 3:15pm.

4H, 5/6B & 5/6C Students

- 4H (Mrs Welsh) 5/6B (Mr Barden) & 56C (Mrs Cremen) students are to enter through the Hodgins Road staff car park driveway.
- Students will line up on the astro- turf and will be taken to class by their teachers.
- Students will be bought out to the same area and dismissed via these gates at 3:15pm.


Student Support Group (SSG Meetings)
