Respectful Relationships

This term all students are learning and practicing their problem-solving skills. One of the keys to being a successful problem solver is for students to recognise there are many ways to solve conflict.

One of the ways we explore this with students is through our classroom

stories. Students are encouraged to identify a conflict that a character may be having and to share their ideas of the many possible ways the character could solve their problem.

As students grow in confidence with this the next step is to discuss what might happen next for each solution for the character with the conflict, and any other characters than may be impacted.

We encourage you to continue this at home when reading a story, or watching something together as a family to empower your children to become positive problem solvers.

Playing our part to build a national picture of child health

From 24th May 2021, our school, along with thousands of others across the country will begin preparations for the fifth Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC gives us a national picture of the development, health and wellbeing of children in their first year of full-time school. Since 2009, the census results have helped communities, schools and governments plan services and develop better policies to target support for children and families.

Children don't miss any class time, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information for the census. The AEDC gives us data at a school and community level - it isn't an assessment of individual children. Some teachers have also noticed that completing the assessments made them more aware of the needs of individual children and the class as a whole and that the census results are useful in planning for transitions to Year 1 and developing class programs.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.
