



### From the Acting Assistant Principal

#### Respectful Relationships

This term all students are learning and practicing their problem-solving skills. It is a normal part of life to come across problems that need solving, sometimes the solution is more obvious than others.

When talking about problem solving with students We are a Respectful Relationships school, it is better to ask questions rather than provide the solution. This practice assists our students to think Michelle Aldridge through the steps themselves the next time a problem arises and make better choices.

Students are invited to come to the Restorative Room to discuss solving problems in appropriate ways. To guide the students thinking staff will ask:

Can you tell me about the problem?

- How did you choose to respond when that happened?
- What impact did your actions have on the problem?
- Can you think of some different ways to respond next time?
- What could we do now to solve the problem?

Without taking the time to reflect on problems that arise our students cannot learn from their mistakes. These questions can also be used at home to encourage your children to become caring and respectful problem solvers who learn from their mistakes.




