Message from the Principal

We look forward to welcoming students back onsite this Friday 11th June.

We would like to acknowledge and thank everyone for all of their hard work and

understanding during this period of remote learning.

Easing of COVID Restrictions

The following restrictions will remain in place until Thursday 17th June;

- All students to return to onsite learning at Hastings Primary School this Friday 11th June.
- Masks will no longer be required outdoors unless you can't maintain 1.5m distance. They will remain a requirement in indoor settings.
- The five reasons to leave home will no longer apply and the travel limit will increase to 25km.
- The only reason to travel outside the 25km travel limit will be for work, education, caregiving or getting vaccinated.
- Travel to regional Victoria is still banned.
- The ban on visitors to households remains in place but outdoor gatherings will be increased to a limit of 10 people.

We appreciate your co-operation by continuing to report to the office whenever visiting the premises to sign in for contact tracing & manually at office for emergencies.

Carpark Safety

As the winter weather settles in, it is timely to remind everyone about before and after school drop offs and pick-ups in the Victoria Street extension.



We have noticed that *some vehicles are reversing into the angle parks* and then pulling out across the double white lines. Ensure you are driving into the angles parks front-first and NOT crossing the centre line.

Please take your time, drive slowly through this area. Always keeping the safety of our students at the forefront of your thinking.

Respectful Relationships

Our Term Two focus continues to be Problem Solving.

Your child can develop their critical and creative thinking skills to explore different types of problems. This can build your child's ability to make responsible decisions that consider the likely consequences of different ways of solving problems.

Here is another activity to try at home to encourage your child to develop their problem solving skills.

Goal: Build collaboration and teamwork at home.

Activity: Using items that are safe and stackable (e.g. paper cups, playing cards), make a tower as tall as you can.

Once your tower is complete, remove one item at a time, trying not to make the tower collapse. Or, if you have Jenga, play it together!

Talk: During the build when things aren't stacking and balancing well talk about the importance of trying a different approach.

Emphasise that trying the same thing over and over will give us the same result each time. To be problem solvers we need to stop, re-think and try a new solution.

Link this to their real life the next time they have a problem by asking, 'What would be a different way that you could approach this problem?'


