What are our students learning in maths?



In Foundation WITH MISS THORNE AND MRS BARRIE

The Foundation students are learning about quantity to 10.

Practise at home by asking your child to collect an amount of objects for you, such as apples or socks. Playing games with dotted dice is also a fun way to practise at home.



In Year 3/4 WITH MR HEWITT, MS KAY AND MRS HUGUENIN

Year 3 and 4 students are learning to measure length and mass.

Practise at home by playing with tape measures, and reading the measurement in centimeters. Weighing food for a recipe can be a great way to explore mass.

Year 1/2

WITH MISS LAKE, MR MINEHAN AND MRS BARRIE

Year 1 and 2 students are learning to partition numbers

Practise at home by making as many sums as you can that equal a set number. Year 1's should work to make 10, while Year 2's are practicing numbers up to 100.



Year 5/6

WITH MS CREMEN, MR BARDEN AND MRS REID

Year 5 and 6 students are learning about decimal places when using money.

Practise at home by adding money amounts, or working out change. Share with your child how you work it out without a calculator, and then use a calculator to double check the answers.

Student Support Group Meetings (SSG's)

On March 28th and 29th our school will be holding Student Support Group Meetings for many of our students. These meetings bring together those with the knowledge and responsibility of a student's learning, so that they can all work together to develop educational goals and associated strategies to achieve them.

This involves understanding and considering a student's interests and strengths and establishing priorities for learning goals and how these will be monitored.

Not all students require an SSG, however if your child does require one a letter will be sent home with more information.

The conversations at the SSG meeting are documented and an Individual Education Plan is developed for the student. This plan provides everyone, including the student, families and school staff, with a structured and clear course of actions for learning progression.

Over the many years we have been running SSG's, we have found that parents and their children have overwhelmingly found the SSG process highly supportive and beneficial.
