### **ANZAC Day 25th April**

The school leaders, along with many other students and staff will represent Hastings Primary School at the ANZAC Day service in Hastings.

Our school leaders, Jaylah Baker and Amelia Jackson will lay a wreath on our behalf.

ANZAC Day is an important national occasion and a time to remember the anniversary of the first major military action fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during WWI.

ANZAC Day marks the anniversary of the Gallipoli Campaign of WWI. ANZAC is an acronym for Australia and New Zealand Army Corps.

At dawn on the 25th of April 1915, soldiers rowed ashore in boats called 'lighters' during the Gallipoli landings, under fire and without outboards motors

Traditionally, Rosemary is worn on ANZAC Day. Rosemary is found growing wild on the Gallipoli Peninsula.

Our goal is to ensure that all students receive the best instruction available to help them learn to read and write and achieve their best.



### How it works

Speech Pathologists and teachers work together to make sure every child's needs are accounted for.



Every child will receive the "Tier 1" level of learning, however, if a child requires some more specialised attention they may *also* receive learning at the "Tier 2" and/or "Tier 3" levels.

This means that no student feels left out, but receives the help they need to learn.

### Why it's important

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

> There is no safe number of days for missing school - each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes. Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

### Getting in early

Attendance patterns are established early – a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and receive lower test scores than their classmates. It's vital that students go to school every day – even in the early years of primary school.
