We are excited to have Jack and Tyler on board at Hastings primary School and I know that you will all make them feel welcome.



Glasses for kids



We have noticed a number of students arriving at school incredibly early. Our school yard is supervised from 8:40 a.m. –9:00 a.m.


Students should arrive at school between
