<u>Attendance</u>

In Victoria it is compulsory for children and young people aged 6-17 years old to attend school. Parents are legally required to ensure their child attends school every day and to provide an explanation for their child's absence from school unless an exemption from attendance has been aranted.

Evidence shows that daily school attendance is important for young people to succeed in education and to ensure they don't fall behind both socially and developmentally. Young people who regularly attend school and complete Year 12 or an equivalent qualification have better health and employment outcomes and enjoy higher incomes.



Schools must record student attendance twice per day in primary school. Under the legislation, if a student of compulsory school age is absent from school for five days within a school year and without a reasonable excuse, then further action can be taken, at the discretion of the Principal.

The Education and Training Reform Act 2006 provides some examples of what a reasonable excuse is for the purposes of explaining a school absence and includes, amongst other considerations:

- Illnesses and accidents;
- Unforeseen and unexplained circumstances;
- ♦ The child has been suspended or expelled; and
- ♦ The child is attending or observing a religious event or obligation.

Unexplained Absence:

A Principal or Principal's delegate will record an absence as 'unexplained' if no explanation about the absence is given to the school by the parent or carer of the student.

If you do not contact the school to provide an explanation on the day of the student absence, the school must attempt to contact the parent or legal guardian either by phone or in writing and seek clarification within three days of the recorded absence.

If no contact can be made with the parent or other carers of the child within 10 days, the absence will be recorded as an unexplained absence and a noted will be made in the child's file. A parent or legal guardian can contact the principal at any time after the recorded absence to provide an explanation.

If a child reaches five days of unapproved or unexplained absence in the preceding 12 months then the school and Principal will work with the parent or legal guardian to implement the appropriate support or intervention to assist the child and ensure they

attend school every day and remain at school during school hours. If the support and intervention do not improve your child's attendance, the Principal may decide to make a referral to the School Attendance Officer. This person is the Regional Director of the Department's Regional Office where you are located.

Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships

As well as learning about Topic 7: 'Gender and Identity' this term, our students will also be learning about Topic 8 'Positive Gender Relations.'

Learning activities within this topic focus on building an understanding of the effects of family violence and focus on the standards associated with respectful relationships. Students develop the skills needed to solve problems, set boundaries within relationships, and play an active role within the prevention of family violence. They develop peer support and help-seeking skills that can be applied in response to situations involving gender-based violence in family, peer, community or on-line relationships.



Talk to your school

If you are experiencing hardship, speak to the School Welfare Officer, Principal or nominated parent payment contact person about support options available.

These may include but are not limited to:

- Payment options including waiving or reducing fees, deferring payments, extending deadlines, flexible payment plans, cost saving alternatives & referrals to government and community assistance programs;
- Referrals to State Schools' Relief (see below);
- Assistance with second hand text books or text book hire schemes;
- Access to a personal device during times where a device is required at school or where a device has not been purchased or leased by the family.

Low cost computers

Computerbank's low cost computers/laptops are available to concession card holders, students and community groups. Computers are refurbished, donated, low cost computers with a keyboard, mouse, monitor, cords, user guide and internet ready with word processing and a range of free programs. Uniform and school shoes

State Schools' Relief (SSR) provides assistance with uniforms, shoes & other items to students in need who are attending a Victorian government school.

In 2019, Prep & Year 7 recipients of the Camps Sports & Excursion Fund (CSEF) automatically qualify for a uniform voucher/pack through SSR. Speak to your Principal or School Welfare Officer to apply. Additional uniform assistance may also be available. www.ssr.net.au

Government Assistance

Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund: Financial assistance provided by the Victorian Government and paid to the school to assist eligible families to cover the costs of camps, sport and excursions.

Parent Payments in Government Schools

The Education and Training Reform Act states that all students in government schools must have free instruction in the standard curriculum program.

Schools can request payment for:

Essential learning items such as text books, stationery, incursions, etc. Speak to your school about the option to buy similar materials from other places that may be cheaper.

Optional items offered in addition to the standard curriculum, which you are not obligated to pay. These may include school magazines, class photos, music tuition, formals etc.

Schools may invite voluntary financial contribution towards a building or library fund but it is optional to pay it. www.education.vic.gov.au/school/parents/ financial/Pages/parentpaymentfaqs.aspx

Stationery

Shops may be cheaper than school ordering. Officeworks will price match and even give a small discount if their advertised price is the more expensive.

Online Shopping

Shopping online for new or second hand school items such as text books, uniforms, laptops/ computers and musical instruments can yield some savings.
