


Congratulations Mrs Thorne

<u>Change to Students</u> Details



Please advise the school office staff should there be any alterations to students details such as: change of phone numbers of parents and emergency contacts, change of address, change to a child's medical conditions etc.

Medical Conditions and Medication

If students need to have medication during school hours the medication will need to be supplied in its original packaging or a dosette box with correct dosage in each day. A Medication Authority Form will need to be completed before medication can be administered. This applies for all medication.

CAMPS SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND

If you hold a current Health Care Card or Pension Card that is valid on the first day of Term 1 or Term 2 this year you may be eligible to apply for CSEF for your child attending Hastings Primary School. If your application is successful, this entitles you to \$125.00 for each of your primary school aged children.

If you think you may be entitled to claim the CSEF for your children and have not already filled out an application form, please contact the school office with your Health Care Card or Pension Card and complete the application form by Friday 3rd March.

School Council Notice of Election

We are indebted to our parents for the great volunteer work they do in representing our school community on School Council. School Council is our governing body which ensures that Hastings Primary School keeps moving onwards and upwards in providing excellence in teaching and learning for our students. If this sounds like something you would like to be involved in, now is the time.

The Department of Education and Training (DET) has approved the commencement of the electoral process for the election of School Councillors for 2023.

1. Membership

Our School Council consists of **eight** parents, **five** members of staff including the principal, and **two** community members.

2. Term of Office

The term of office is for two years, with half of the members retiring each year, but eligible for re-election.

Three parents and one staff end their term of office at the start of 2023.

3. Retiring School Councillors

The following members of School Council, some being eligible for re-election, will retire at the end of this month:

Parents: Hannah Mendelson, Dave Gardner, Michelle Burridge and Julie Coster

Community: Henry Godfrey

Staff: Michelle Aldridge

4. Proposed Timetable for Elections

5. Voting

If the number of nominations exceeds the vacancies in

either the parent or staff electorates, an election will be necessary. All parents are entitled to vote for parent representatives and can vote for the staff representatives.

6. Methods of Voting

There are two ways in which you can record your vote on the official voting form, from Thursday 9th March to 9.00 am on Monday 13th March 2023.

- (a) Post your vote to school to arrive by 9.00 am on Monday 13th March 2023
- **(b)** Vote in person at school at the Office, between 8.40am and 4.00pm, from Thursday 9th March to 9.00 am on Monday 13th March 2023.

7. Nominations of Candidates

There are two distinct categories of elected members of School Council: Parent and Staff/DET Employees.

8. Parent Member Category

DET employees, who are parents at the school, are now eligible for election to this category. However, there is a limit on the number of DET parent members for a given school council configuration. (The total number of DET employee members must be less than half of the total number on School Council.)

9. DET Employee Member Category

To be eligible for election to this category, a person must be a DET employee and either:

- a parent of a student at the school, and/or
- employed to work at/for the school.

Attendance - Every Day Counts!

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education.

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

There is no 'safe' number of days for missing school. Students learn new things every day, therefore each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Attendance patterns are established early – a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and receive lower test scores than their classmates. It's vital that students go to school every day – even in the early years of primary school.

The main reasons for absence are:

Sickness - There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, and setting good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.


Holidays – Holidays should be planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term if it can be avoided.

"Day off" – Think twice before letting your child have just a "day off" as they could fall behind their classmates – every day counts.

Openly communicating with your child's school about all absences is a good way to prevent attendance issues being escalated to a School Attendance Officer. A School Attendance Officer is a Department of Education and Early Childhood Development Regional Director who has authority to follow up attendance issues. Attendance issues that are escalated can lead to an Infringement Notice.

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let me know so that we can work together to get your child to school every day.


