ANZAC Day 25th April

The school leaders, along with many other students and staff will have the opportunity to represent Hastings Primary School at the ANZAC Day service in Hastings.

Our school leaders will lay a wreath on our behalf.

ANZAC Day is an important national occasion and a time to remember the anniversary of the first major military action fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during WWI.

ANZAC Day marks the anniversary of the Gallipoli Campaign of WWI. ANZAC is an acronym for Australia and New Zealand Army Corps.

At dawn on the 25th of April 1915, soldiers rowed ashore in boats called 'lighters' during the Gallipoli landings, under fire and without outboards motors

Traditionally, Rosemary is worn on ANZAC Day. Rosemary is found growing wild on the Gallipoli Peninsula.

<u>Koorie Kids Day Out</u>

On Friday 17th March our Koorie students were invited to Willum Warrain for 'Koorie Kids Day Out' where they gathered to meet with students from 10 other schools. Attendance – 'Did you know?

Did you know that being late regularly can affect academic performance? If I a student is late for 10 minutes a day that equals missing 13 weeks of learning over their 13 years of school (Prep-Year 12) Did you know that if your child misses 1 day per fortnight they will miss a 1½ years of schooling? Missing School = Missing Out

If your child is sick or absent, you are required to notify us as soon as possible **on the day of absence** using one of the following methods:

Online: log onto the Sentral Parent Portal.

Telephone: the school office absence line and leave a message with your child's name, class, date of absences and reason.

Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility.

Mindfulness and Meditation

Mindfulness can add to the quality of our lives in numerous ways, from nurturing a sense of inner peace to improving the quality of a workout, from enhancing self-confidence to facilitating deeper and more meaningful relationships with others.

In children specifically, mindfulness has been found to:

mitigate the effects of **bullying** (Zhou, Liu, Niu, Sun, & Fan, 2016)

enhance focus in children with ADHD (Zhang et al., 2016)

reduce attention problems (Crescentini, Capurso, Furlan, & Fabbro, 2016).

improving mental health and wellbeing

improve social skills when well taught and practiced in children and adolescents.

In each newsletter I will give you a new activity to try with your child/ren.

Focus on Breathing

Breathing exercises are a powerful tool that can be taught to children to empower them to selfregulate their emotions. Encouraging children to sit quietly and focus on their breathing is a quick and easy way to calm your children.

Here are some breathing exercises:

Flower Breath: Imagine smelling a beautiful flower, breath in through the nose and out the mouth, releasing any tension. Stop and smell the roses, daffodils, daisies or any other flower they like. This is a simple way to connect kids to their breath and how it helps them to feel.

Bunny Breath: Just 3 quick sniffs in the nose and one long exhale out the nose. Invite kids to pretend to be bunnies, sniffing the air for other bunnies, carrots to eat, or safety. It can be a lovely cleansing breath when you use it in this way.

Have a safe and happy Easter break, I hope the Easter Bunny visits you all!
