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Bushfire Preparedness

School procedures for the bushfire season

With the bush fire season upon us we need to remain vigilant and prepared.



Fire danger ratings and warnings are used in Victoria to provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life.

Schools and children's services listed on the DET Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) will be closed on days declared by Fire Authorities as a Code Red fire danger day.

Our school has been identified as being one of those at high bushfire risk and is listed on the BARR.

Where possible, we will provide parents with up to three days notice of a planned closure. We will contact you directly by letter with advice on planned closures and will confirm the decision to close by 12 noon the day before the planned closure. The communication process at our school will be:

A notice will be sent to all families as soon as we have notification of a Code Red Day. This may be up to 3 days in advance.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child.

It is also important to note that:

- No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Code Red day.
- Out-of-school-hours care will also be cancelled on these days
- School camps will be cancelled if a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined for the Bureau of Meteorology district in which the camp is located.

On these Code Red days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – on such days children should never be left at home or in the care of older children.

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that when Code Red days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Code Red day.

What can parents do?

- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to -date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is closed.
- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers.
- Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters and by talking to your child's teacher or any other member of the teaching staff about our emergency management plan.
- If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.

Nude Food Wednesdays

Nude Food is a popular term, but what exactly does this mean? Simply put, it's food without excess packaging. Usually, this means food that is not processed, often making it a healthier and more environmentally friendly option. Nude Food reduces the amount of 'stuff' that needs to go in bins to be sent to landfill. Durable, reusable containers are a great way to bring food, as they may last from Prep to Year 6, and beyond, providing long term cost savings and environmental benefits.

This term the SRC (student representative council) are running a competition every Wednesday - for the next 5 weeks, looking for the class with the most 'nude food' with prizes to be won.

Nude Food Tips:

Use a Bento style lunch box. This reduces cling wrap and other plastics. I have seen many Bento boxes around the school and many families who already send their child/ren to school with nude food.

Look for snacks that come in a bulk buy option and portion them in reusable containers. E.g. pretzels, dried fruits, crackers, popcorn. Cut blocks of cheese to create cheese sticks, rather than buying prepackaged.

Make your own snacks. E.g. muffins, cupcakes, bliss balls.

Walk to School/Crazy Sock Day

In conjunction with 'Walk to School month' the SRC are organizing a Crazy Sock Day on Walk to School Day (Friday 27th October) as a fundraiser. Wear the craziest socks you can and bring a gold coin donation.
