## **Being Bushfire Prepared**

### **Emergency DRILLs help us PREPARE**

With the bush fire season upon us we need to remain vigilant and prepared.

Our school has been identified as being one of those at high bushfire risk and is listed on the BARR.

Last newsletter included the procedure for a **CODE RED DAY** at Hastings PS.

Today our school participated in an Emergency Drill where we simulated being required to SHELTER IN PLACE due to an imminent threat of a bush fire.

Our school hall is an approved SHELTER IN PLACE venue which has reinforced screens and guttering protection.

Our students and staff followed our Shelter in Place procedure quickly and efficiently today. Classrooms also had discussions around why these DRILLS are so important.

### What can families do?

On these Code Red days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – on such days children should never be left at home or in the care of older children.

Because we live in a bushfire prone area, the Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that when Code Red days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Code Red day.

- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to
   -date and includes alternative care arrangements
   in the event that our school is closed.
- ♦ Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers.
- Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters and by talking to your child's teacher or any other member of the teaching staff about our emergency management plan.
- ◆ If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.
