If students need to have medication during school hours the medication will




need to be supplied in its original packaging or a dosette box with correct dosage in each day. A Medication Authority Form will need to be completed before medication can be administered. This applies for all medication.

SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS

We are indebted to our parents for the great volunteer work they do in representing our school community on School Council. School Council is our governing body which ensures that Hastings Primary School keeps moving onwards and upwards in providing excellence in teaching and learning for our students. If this sounds like something you would like to be involved in, now is the time.

The Department of Education and Training (DET) has approved the commencement of the electoral process for the election of School Councillors for 2024.

1. Membership

Our School Council consists of eight parents, five members of staff including the principal, and two community members.

2. Term of Office

The term of office is for two years, with half of the members retiring each year, but eligible for reelection.

Three parents and two staff end their term of office at the start of 2024.

3. End of term School Councillors

The following members of School Council, are eligible for re-election,

4. Proposed Timetable for Elections

Voting

If the number of nominations exceeds the vacancies in either the parent or staff electorates, an election will be necessary. All parents are entitled to vote for parent representatives and can vote for the staff representatives.

6. Methods of Voting

There are two ways in which you can record your vote on the official voting form, from Thursday 7th March to 9.00 am on Tuesday 12th March 2024.

- (a) Post your vote to school to arrive by 9.00 am on Tuesday 12th March 2024
- (b) Vote in person at school at the Office, between 8.40am and 4.00pm, from Thursday 7th March to 9.00 am on Tuesday 12th March 2024.

7. Nominations of Candidates

There are two distinct categories of elected members of School Council: Parent and Staff/DET Employees.

8. Parent Member Category

DET employees, who are parents at the school, are now eligible for election to this category. However, there is a limit on the number of DET parent members for a given school council configuration. (The total number of DET employee members must be less than half of the total number on School Council.)

9. DET Employee Member Category

To be eligible for election to this category, a person must be a DET employee and either:

- employed to work at/for the school.

If the number of nominations is less than the number of vacancies, a notice to that effect and calling for further nominations will be posted in a prominent position at the school.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyon the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

\$150 for primary school students

\$250 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.

changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.







ASSISTANT DRINCIPAL REPORT

ATTENDANCE -

The school day begins at 8:50am at Hastings Primary School and finishes at 3:15pm.

Students who have 5 days or more unexplained this term will be required to have an attendance learning plan. Please ensure you are recording your child's absence via the school office absence line or via Compass.

If your child arrives after 9:00am they are late and are required to be signed in at the office by a parent before heading to the classroom.

What impact does being late have on the student?

Students who are late miss a lot of instructions and information about what is happening, not to mention important learning sessions. This means that they have to catch up somehow. Students also miss out on catching up with their friends in the playground before school. Students can feel unsettled, disorganized and unhappy for the rest of the day and it can take them some time to complete and understand the work that they have missed. It's similar to being late to see a movie and not being able to understand what's happening because you have missed out on who the characters are and what the plot is.

How does it affect the other students in the class?

Students who are late have an unsettling effect on the rest of the class. Because not all late students arrive at once, the interruptions go on until the last student is settled. Students who are late often have things that need to be done prior to them joining the class and this causes even more disruption.

A student who is half an hour late each day misses the equivalent of 16.6 days of learning each year.

Victoria St. carpark

Many families are making illegal U-turns on Victoria St. after drop off. I witnessed a very close 'near miss' between a car and a student this week. All vehicles entering Victoria St, must continue to the turning circle at the end of the street to exit for the safety of our students.
