Reconciliation Week

National Reconciliation Week runs from 27 May to 3 June each year and is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. At Hastings Primary School we acknowledge what happened in the past and celebrate our commitment to reconciliation through the teaching of First Nations in our curriculum but also during these special weeks.

All classes this week have been using texts, videos and stories to discuss National Sorry Day, the Stolen Generation and reconciliation. Our specialists subjects have all incorporated reconciliation into their classes too with different 'yulunga' games being played in P.E, how our First Nations people used items from the land to make music and sounds to communicate stories in Performing Arts and of course various pieces of Art have been created.

Enrol your child in Foundation for 2025

You will be able to apply to enrol your child in Foundation (Prep) 2025 at Hastings Primary School **from 15 April 2024**.

If you have a child starting primary school in 2025, it's time to enrol. Make sure to submit your enrolment application by **Friday 26 July 2024.**

If you are enrolling the sibling of a student at our school for Foundation in 2025, and both children will be attending our school at the same time, your child is prioritised for a place at our school as per the department's Placement Policy.

It is important to follow the statewide timeline to enrol your child in Foundation. Enrolling your child in line with the timelines allows us to plan our classrooms, staffing and transition activities and ensures your child has the best start to school.

Editing and finalising their story.







CARPARK Safety


The carpark area along Victoria
