2024 PARENT/CARER/GUARDIAN OPINION SURVEY

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents / caregivers / guardians think of our school.

The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, and student engagement. The survey is optional but we encourage all families to participate.

Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

All families are invited to participate in the survey.

The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey will be open from Monday 29th of July to Friday 30th of August 2024.

The survey will be conducted online, only takes 20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones.

The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese.

If you are enrolling the sibling of a student at our school for Foundation in 2025, and both children will be attending our school at the same time, your child is prioritised for a place at our school as per the department's Placement Policy.

It is important to follow the statewide timeline to enrol your child in Foundation. Enrolling your child in line with the timelines allows us to plan our classrooms, staffing and transition activities and ensures your child has the best start to school.

In today's digital age, the internet offers a wealth of educational resources and entertainment for children. However, it also presents various risks, especially for primary school-aged students. Ensuring their safety online is a critical concern for parents, educators, and caregivers. Here are some practical tips to help keep young children safe while they navigate the digital world.

Maintaining an open line of communication with your child about their online activities is essential. Encourage them to talk about what they do online and any uncomfortable experiences they encounter. This openness will help you stay informed and provide guidance when needed.

Establish clear rules for internet use, including which websites they can visit, how much time they can spend online, and what information they should never share (such as their name, address, or school). Make sure they understand the importance of these rules for their safety.

Utilize parental control software and tools to monitor and limit your child's online activities. In Our Classrooms


The **Year 1 and 2** students have been building their understanding of **multiplication** by exploring arrays.


