## Final day Crossing Supervision

The 1.30pm dismissal time causes us a road safety issue as the Mornington Peninsula Shire does not permit supervisors to attend the crossings at this time. Therefore, we will have Teaching Staff supervising the crossing on Hodgins Rd and at the Kings Creek crossing.

In particular, the students using the crossing at Kings Creek will be expected to walk with the teachers after school.

Maths Magic: Fun Christmas Activities at Home!

Activity	Age Group	Materials	Instructions
Christmas Tree Shape Sorting	5-7	Cutouts of shapes in festive colors	Sort shapes into groups, count them, and arrange them to decorate a paper Christmas tree.
Ornament Patterns	5-10	Coloured paper, glue, or actual ornaments	Create repeating patterns using ornaments, e.g., red-green-red-green.
Candy Cane Measurement	5-12	Candy canes, rulers, or measuring tape	Measure lengths of candy canes, compare them, and calculate average length for older children.
Christmas Cookie Fractions	7-12	Cookies and icing or toppings	Decorate cookies to represent fractions (e.g., half with red icing, a quarter with green).
Holiday Shopping Budget	8-12	Toy catalog or online store pages	Give kids a "budget" to pick gifts for family members, add totals, and calculate change.
Snowflake Symmetry	7-12	Paper and scissors	Create paper snowflakes, identify lines of symmetry; younger kids count points, older discuss angles.
Christmas Countdown	5-12	Advent calendar or homemade countdown chart	Solve a math problem each day to reveal a treat or a clue for the next activity.



# **PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY**

#### **ONE PAGE OVERVIEW**



#### **FREE INSTRUCTION**

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access
  to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the
  requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the
  Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the
  Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

#### **PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS**

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



#### **Curriculum Contributions**

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

# Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

# Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



#### FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



#### SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
