Cybersafety - screen time part 4

Don't have the TV on in the background

Children learn from their environments and background TV may divert a child's attention from play and learning. Our research found children had better thinking, reasoning and language abilities when there was less background TV in the home. This can also be because of less conversations between parents and children when there is a TV on in the background.

So, when the TV is not actively being watched, consider turning it off so children can play, listen and learn.
